PRESENTATION

Michael Parker makes a presentation about Cleanup Greenup Day. He starts by saying there are so many people behind the scenes that makes this day a success. See attached pamphlet. This year the date is April 24, 2021 10AM-12 NOON which is hosted by Beautify Billerica. This year they are focusing on cleaning up trash. DPW and Recreation Dept is helping out greatly. 25 people maximum will be at each site due to COVID restrictions.

Chairman Rosa thanks Mr. Parker for coming on and making the presentation. Selectman Burns thanks Mr. Parker and Mr. Kelly for this event. You are making a difference. Selectman Burns will be helping out. Ed Tierney and DPW have done herculeon efforts in picking up the debris. Selectman Conway says diddo and adds a thank you to Beautify Billerica she is very appreciative. She thanks Mr. Parker for stepping up to him and all of the workers. She thanks DPW crew as well.

Selectman Deslaurier says channel 10 came out and its going to be televised and great kudos to Mr. Parker and crew. Mr. Deslaurier says it's a great effort and positive experience that he and his family had had previously joining this venture. Selectman Burrows states it's a fun event, very diverse group, no politics – great effort and very fulfilling. He is very appreciative for all the efforts.

Mr. Parker comments with regards to Selectman Deslaurier comment stating he (Mr. Parker) did initially start this effort alone and his crew has grown. Chairman Rosa echoes all of the comments made. Mary Leach, Lance Kelly and hundreds of other volunteers do an incredible job. Mr. Rosa will try to get vests for the participants. Can anyone clean up their own neighborhood if they wanted? Yes, just let Mr. Parker know and he will arrange pickup of trash.

Are bags made available from DPW? Mr. Rosa asks if Waste Management would pick up the yellow bags from residences? Mr. Curran says he will coordinate a process for pickup.

TOWN MANAGERS REPORT see attached

Update to water billing report.....Mr. Curran states this is a timely thing. Next 2 billing cycles will be 5.5 months cycle. New cycle starts on July 1. The cycles are shifted so the start date will begin in July. A flyer will come out in April bill and explain new billing information. There are under 200 accounts that have not been outfitted with a new meter. 1100 endpoints have failed. Company is supplying us with new endpoints. There is a plan in place if they fail in the future.

Pond Street Sewer break.....town is finishing layer sewer pipe in that area. There are complications in that area as far as topography. Bad news is it is extremely expensive to fix. There are 2 articles being submitted to fix this issue.

NBC 10 is doing a series on Billerica. It's a positive series about towns in the commonwealth.

Police chiefs assessment center process is underway.

Early voting ballots are available. You can make a request now online.

Budget process....not a very successful year due to COVID

Fire station making headway - going smoothly.

PHR going in front of CPC March 25 for public hearing. Bathrooms discussion – needs to expand on bathrooms at facility.

PUD's – found online.

COVID testing has dropped off significantly. The story now is we've plateaued.

Selectman Conway asks about water billing. She thinks its important to remind people of adjustment to bills. Its amazing how much the bill can be affected by water leaks. She is very happy with work that's been done. What is the process to get people on board if they are resisting new meters? Mr. Curran comments appointments need to be made. Send notices to get new meter....after so many unanswered notices they would get a shut off notice. Someone would go out and mark the street – there are a lot of steps to go through before shutoff. The town doesn't shut water off as a practice due to non payment. Non payment is applied to their real estate bills. Selectman Conway like absentee voting and glad its happening. COVID update - 22.2% have been vaccinated. Mr. Curran says that is fully vaccinated.

Selectman Burns comments on water billing. Use the “eyes on water” app. It will show any leaks. He has a question on billing cycle. Why are we billing again in August? April and December are long billing cycles in FY21.

Mr. Alkhatib comments as of July 1 we will go 4 months for a billing period. There will be 2 billings for 5 months. We had to send out in a timely manner that did not conflict with real estate bills, excise tax bills, etc. Mr. Curran states we are trying to have everyones bills for the same time period. Selectman Burns thinks an explanation needs to be included with every bill. With regards to endpoint failures – why are we seeing so many? The company came out with an upgrade endpoint. Some are not getting cell signal, some are installation problem. It varies. Mr. Alkhatib is trying to get the number to zero failures. Selectman Burns comments things are moving along on other topics.

Selectman Deslaurier speaks on Vining and Ditson – demo starting at same time. Vining done by August and Ditson by July. People have contacted Andrew about taking a piece of history from the school. Everyone has touched on everything else.

Selectman Burrows – everyone has touched on everything. Drainage problems at the high school. Can we take precautions so that doesn't happen at PHR. Mr. Curran says high school is different at high school drainage goes under the field. He will be looking for that issue. Selectman Burrows states that Mr. Gunther appreciates the efforts at Parker Street.

Chairman Rosa speaking about endpoints. 1100 is a lot to fail. His has failed and couldn't be fixed because of COVID. Why wouldn't we have company swap out new endpoints now? Mr. Alkhatib says that is what the town is doing. Chairman Rosa thinks we should tell them to replace all of the endpoints. He thinks changing the window in billing cycle is great. Everyone has talked about everything else.

Select Board Code of Conduct and Ethics – see attached. Selectman Conway thanks Selectman Burns for putting a positive spin on her paperwork.

Selectman Conway likes that this applies to everyone, i.e. people the board appoints. She wants it to cover select board members and their appointees. She also would include running meeting and Roberts Rules. She is asking this be voted on as 1st reading.

Selectman Burns states its based on a number of looking at other towns and their policies. The only differences are that I'm looking for something that is more overarching – including employees.

Mr. Curran weighs in....a compromise..... this document is written to elected officials. He thinks it should be a separate document thru the board of selectman for employees.

Chairman Rosa thinks that not all would fall under this. There should be someway to get moderator appointments morfed into this. This should be town wide. This doesn't include mixed committees. This needs tweeking.

Selectman Deslaurier said he thinks this is a pretty solid document. Good work by both Selectman Burns and Conway.

Selectman Burrows comments if things aren't right – we work for the people – and have to address situations. People need to be responsible for their actions.

Selectman Conway doesn't want to include municipal employees because they don't work for us. She thinks we should all have a code of conduct. She is willing to tweek this.

Selectman Burns continues on about what everyone else just stated. Mr. Curran asks if he should “hang tight” til this is passed? Chairman Rosa says we need to each act profession towards other members of town government. He tells Mr. Curran he should get started on this.

APPROVAL OF TOWN MEETING ARTICLE TOWN HALL PARKING LOT PROJECT

Mr. Curran wants to take surplus money to buy parking lot. Mr. Curran expands on article 17...purchase of land for \$95,000. Article 18 was never acted on. I’ve asked Chairman Rosa if he could sponsor the article. It’s a placeholder of 1 million dollars for the parking lot. It would add about 40 spaces and pedestrian accessibility. If the board wants to act on it they can.

Selectman Burns makes a motion to recommend a placeholder for town hall parking lot for town meeting. Seconded by Selectman Burrows. Selectman Conway-AYE, Selectman Deslaurier-AYE, Selectman Burns-AYE, Selectman Burrows-AYE, Chairman Rosa-AYE.

DISCUSSION ON HOW TO CALL SPECIAL SELECT BOARD MEETINGS

Selectman Conway is concerned that the board isn’t contacted to see if they are available. Every effort should be made to include all Selectmen. She wants an open conversation about scheduling special meetings. Section 2.3 addresses you issues according to Chairman Rosa. Mr. Rosa speaks about the last meeting, he got a call front Mr. Curran calling about the sewer (force) main that broke. He needed to get the articles on town meeting for repair. Selectman Conway doesn’t think its asking a lot to take schedules of others in mind. Mr. Curran adds usually when a special meeting is called in the middle of the day...its matter of fact. You don’t need a full board. Maybe I could write something up. 1. Send out date 2. Send out time 3. Is everyone available. What optional time is convenient?

Selectman Burns agrees with Selectman Conway.

COMMUNITY FUND COMMITTEES

Chairman Rosa appoints Selectman Burns and Burrows to Pharmaluncene committee and himself and Selectman Deslaurier to E Ink.

NEW BUSINESS

High Octane Harley One Chelmsford Rd has applied for 9 separate One Day Special Beer & Wine Licenses:

Chairman Rosa states insurance binder has expired. Does Mark Caufman still work there. His first question is expiration of liability insurance. Ms Gac has new insurance – they just changed insurance companies. Mr. Rosa says its an insurance bill and the town requires a certificate of insurance. If the board approves this it is contingent upon getting the new insurance certificate.

We have never had “entertainment” on the application before. I would suggest getting an entertainment license and come before the board. Ms Gac agrees. No questions from the board. The following applies to all of your 1 day license.

“The license holder shall comply with any federal, state or local health requirements related to the COVID 19 Pandemic, including any orders of the governor or commonwealth dept of public health. Further, it must be noted that the license may be subject to revocation should public health concerns so require.”

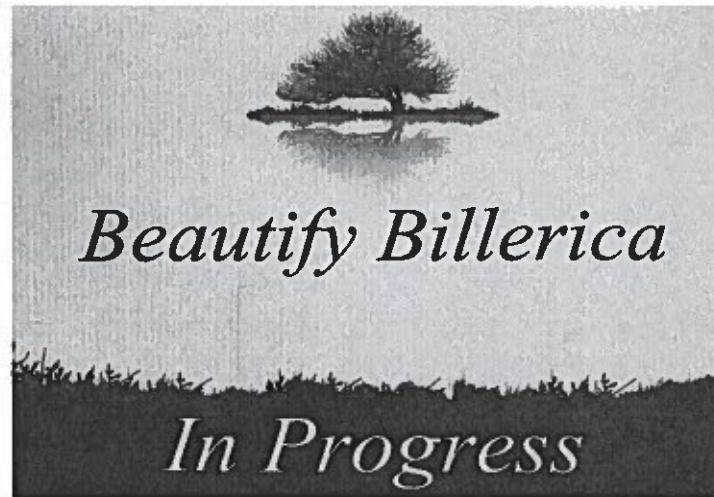

Water Billing

The next two billing cycles, April and August, will be based on a 5 and a half month cycle to pivot to the new billing cycle that begins on July 1, 2021. The tiers will be adjusted to reflect the extended billing period – for example the first tier is normally 0-2,000 cubic feet is changed to 0-2,750 cubic feet. This will allow for the next billing cycle to begin on July 1, 2021 and the rates will take effect at the beginning of that cycle and there will be no retroactive billing. A flyer was distributed to all water and sewer customers explaining these changes in their December bill. It will also be distributed in the April bill as well. The Town will acclimate to this new billing cycle for the next two years.

There are under 200 accounts that have not been outfitted with a new meter and endpoint. These accounts are not done due to a combination of factors. COVID 19 has prohibited the Town from entering these households. Some of these hook ups have extenuating circumstances such as no shut-off valve on the street or other adverse mechanical circumstances. A small percentage of these hook-ups are due to extreme resistance. As COVID 19 subsides we will begin to reschedule the replacement of these meters.

There are approximately 1,100 endpoints that have failed. The vendor is replacing these free of charge. Over the next two months, the Town will be working with the vendor to notify residents and schedule appointments to replace these endpoints. The process should take several months. The manufacturer of the endpoints is supplying the Town with extra stock to replace endpoints that fail in the future. Some of these accounts, not all, will be estimated if it failed before the final read.

Pond Street Sewer Break

The break occurred at the Pond Street Bridge opposite the Rod and Gun Club. A similar break occurred in the same location in June of 2020. The Town is in the process of laying down a 3,000 LFt. sewer bypass above ground. This whole process is exacerbated by a railroad easement, wetland jurisdictional issues, meeting all DEP requirements and the line traversing through a wetland and under

a bridge. Once the bypass is complete the Town will implement a permanent fix. The temporary bypass should be completed by early next week. The permanent fix should take a couple of weeks to finish work and assess impacts. There is no effect on Town sewer service and environment impacts are minimal and under control for the time being.

As you know, two articles have been submitted to Town Meeting. The first will address this repair. The second article is the design for the rehabilitation of the force sewer main that is 15,000 LF of 18" ductile Iron Pipe that was constructed in 1973 and it plays a critical role in the Town's sewer conveyance system, conveying approximately 4,000 gpm (approximately 30% of the Town's wastewater flow) from the Brown Street Pump Station to the Rogers Street Pump Station before reaching the Town's Wastewater Treatment Plant. The Fall Town Meeting will include an article to fund the construction of this project.

Olessa Stepanova from Channel 10 is doing a series on Billerica next week. They are interviewing several people from the Town. I did an interview with them last week. It is series intended to highlight communities in the Commonwealth.

Police Chief Assessment Center

The Town is in the process of finalizing an agreement with Fred Ryan to conduct the Police Chief Assessment Center. Ryan was the former Police Chief in Arlington and served as the Co-Chair of the Police Assisted Addiction and Recovery Initiative for many years. Fred has conducted assessment centers, executive coaching, and police operation consulting for Cities and Towns throughout the Commonwealth. The Town has also sent in a requisition to Civil Service for a Departmental Promotional Sole Assessment Center with Education and Experience for Police Chief.

Capital Facilities Study

This office received 3 bids for the project on Friday. BHA, Gorman Richardson and Lewis, and LLB Architects have all submitted proposals. The Town will review these submissions and bring the best two to the Capital Facilities Study Commission depending on schedules. In the last meeting Recreation, COA, and Housing gave presentations on current and future needs. An awareness campaign for the committee and its work will begin to take shape after Town Meeting.

Absentee / Early Voting Ballots

Governor Charlie Baker recently signed a law into effect that extends many pandemic related voting changes. One of the changes was the extension of mail in voting. This office has worked with Town Clerk, Shirley Shultz to make absentee / early voting ballots available through an online request. Previously you would need to mail an application to the Town Clerk to receive a ballot. Now you can make the request online and a ballot will be mailed to your home. This was also utilized during the last election.

Budget Process

Last week FinCom finished up the budget process. It was another very successful year with overwhelming majority votes on all budgets. I look forward to presenting the budget to Town Meeting and starting another Fiscal Year.

Fire Station

Masonry work will begin on Monday. The project is moving along smoothly. Many of the trigger points have now been passed including demo, abatement, steel, and weather. Less than one percent of the contingency has been used to date. This is a positive trend particularly because the project is out of

the ground and the hazmat abatement is complete. Attached are some photos to show the current progress.

Peggy Hannon Rizza (PHR)

PHR will be going in front of the CPC for a public hearing on March 25th. At the last meeting bathrooms were a topic of discussion. The Town is working with Warner Larson and Perkins and Will to determine a solution to be brought to the committee on Thursday. The Recreation Committee voted on March 18th to increase the Article appropriation to accommodate the bathroom request.

Vining and Ditson

The Town has been working with BETA and Left Field and other vendors for the Ditson and Vining Projects. As of this point we are on schedule and on budget. Cost estimates are lower than the appropriation included in the warrant article.


Smart Growth Forum

The Smart Growth Committee is holding a virtual Community Forum to discuss the draft Mixed Use Overlay Zoning District and the replacement of the Planned Unit Development Overlay District. An Executive Summary and the draft Zoning District can be found on the Town of Billerica website under the Planning Board.

COVID 19 Update

The Town seems to be plateauing. The positivity rate has gone down to 2.70% but testing has dropped off as well. The Town is lagging behind the state average in number of people vaccinated (22.2%).

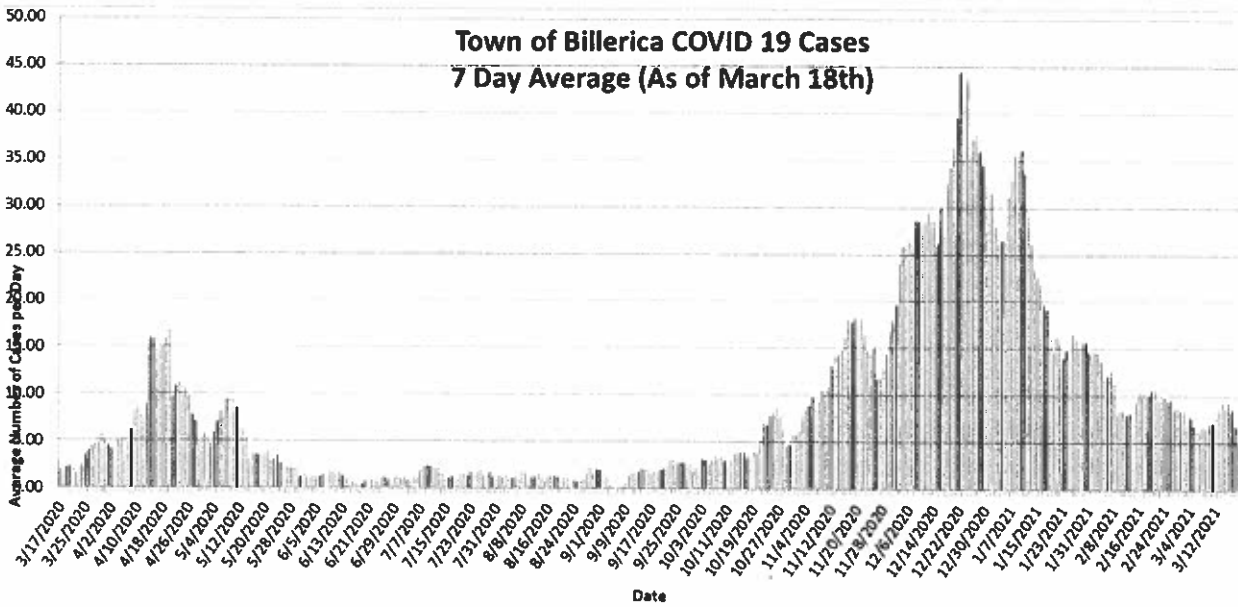

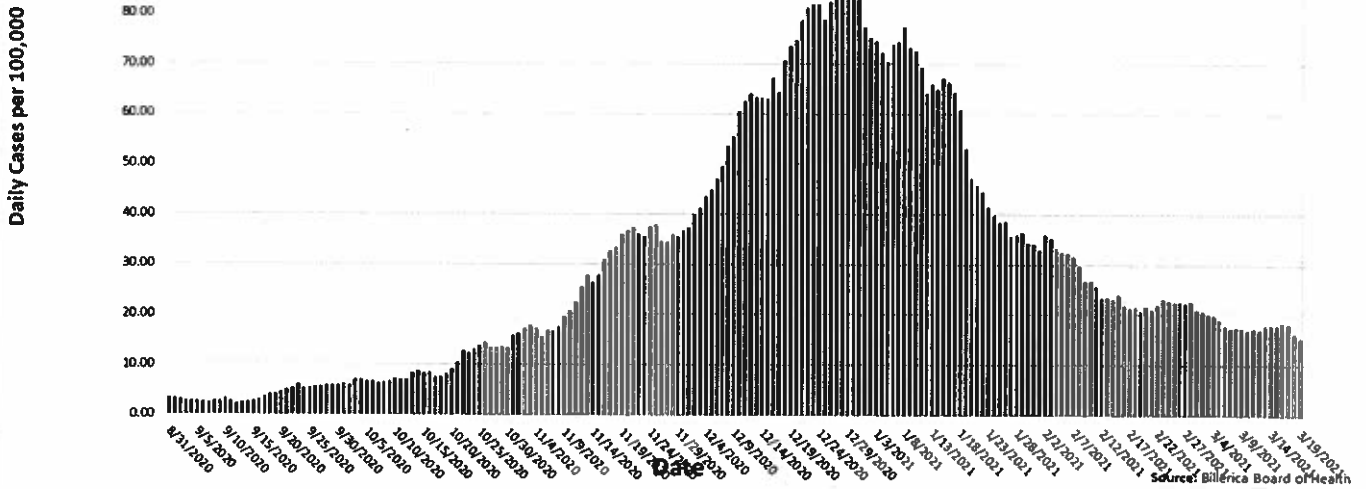
Town of Billerica COVID 19 Cases 7 Day Average (As of March 18th)

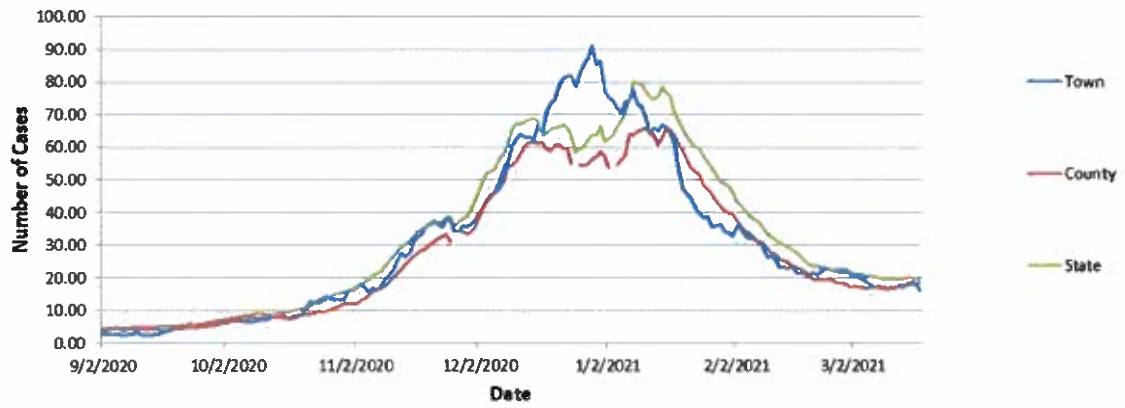
